

Series Introduction: Jesus in the House

Session 1: The News of His Presence

The Scripture Path: Mark 2:1–2.

Thematic Insights: The news that **Jesus was "in the house"** acts as a beacon of hope. In a hostile world, the reality of His presence is the most vital news we can share. He is not a distant deity but a Savior who comes to where we live.

Reflection & Response: If it were "noised" today that Jesus is truly present in your home or your current struggle, what would change? How does knowing the resurrected Son of God is with you, provide you with hope today?

Session 2: The Disruption of Grace

The Scripture Path: Mark 2:3–4.

Thematic Insights: From the homeowner's view, the arrival of those seeking Jesus looked like "**vandalism**" as they tore into his roof. Grace is often disruptive to our comfort, but the Son of God is worth any earthly cost or inconvenience.

Reflection & Response: Are you more protective of your personal "property" and comfort, or are you willing to embrace the disruption that comes when people are desperate to reach the Savior?

Session 3: The Magnetic Savior

The Scripture Path: Mark 2:2.

Thematic Insights: The presence of Jesus is magnetic; the word goes out and the house becomes so full there is "**no room left**". In a weary world, people are still drawn to the resurrected Christ because He alone holds the words of eternal life.

Reflection & Response: Does your life "noise abroad" the presence of Jesus in a way that draws others toward Him, even if it creates a "crowded" or busy season for you?

Session 4: The Nature of Audacious Faith

The Scripture Path: Mark 2:5.

Thematic Insights: The four friends displayed "**unbelievable and audacious**" faith. Desperation in a hostile world often fuels the kind of faith that refuses to take "no" for an answer. Jesus is moved when He sees such faith in action.

Reflection & Response: What "audacious" step is the Holy Spirit calling you to take? Is there someone you need to carry to the feet of the Son of God, regardless of the obstacles?

Session 5: The Eternal Perspective

Thematic Insights: The homeowner is left with a "**hole in my roof**" after the crowds leave, but he has witnessed the power of God. Our temporary losses or "holes" are insignificant compared to the eternal work the resurrected Son of God performs in our midst.

Reflection & Response: Can you look past the "holes" or damages life has dealt you to see the miraculous work Jesus is doing through them?

Thematic Insights: To understand the full scope of Christ's hope, we must look at the story from different angles—shifting from the homeowner's perspective to those outside the house.

Reflection & Response: As you look at this narrative again, which character's perspective speaks most to your current spiritual journey with the Lord?

Session 7: The Cost of Preparation

Reflection & Response: How are you "observing the movements" of the Lord in your life right now? What are you doing to prepare for your next encounter with Him?
